Receiving the 2018 Award for Outstanding Contribution to Evaluation from the Australian Evaluation Society (AES), Dr Jess Dart is a recognised leader with over 25 years' experience in strategy, design and evaluation for organisations in Australia and overseas. She specialises in collaborative evaluation and the design of initiatives with complex, intangible outcomes. As part of her PhD she adapted the 'Most Significant Change (MSC) Technique' and co-authored the User Guide with Rick Davies – now translated into 12 languages. She is passionate about ensuring that organisations deliver better and more equitable outcomes. In 2005, Jess founded Clear Horizon Consulting, a rapidly growing and successful company with over 40 employees. Today she is Founding Director, Chief Evaluator and Chair of the Board.

Developmental Evaluation



Jess has led over 10 large scale developmental evaluations and is co-authored the e-learning course on developmental evaluation for the Clear Horizon academy. Recent examples include:

Our Town is a ground-breaking community-led mental health initiative operative across six rural towns in South Australia aiming to create transformational change with regard to mental health and wellbeing. (2019-2031). The developmental evaluation role includes developing and implementing the overarching evaluation framework as well as episodic process evaluations, playing the role of

critical friend, and supporting the towns to demonstrate impact and learn and adapt as they implement.
